Workshop – September 25, 2021

Immanuel is hosting a workshop on Saturday, September 25, 2021 for all those interested in native gardens. The workshop will be led by Gail Fennell of Nature Regina, and will give participants information and ideas on how they can incorporate a native garden in their yards.

The workshop will be held outside, so dress for the weather! Meet at 10:00 am near the back doors to the Royal Saskatchewan Museum. This is the entrance off the parking lot, and where the native garden is. You can register for this workshop on the Immanuel website. Registration is not required, however if you do register it allows us to contact you in case of inclement weather.

Conduct a Home Waste Audit

Understanding what you are sending to the landfill is the first step to reducing it and moving toward zero waste.

Any small change you make will truly make a difference, and is a step in the overall journey of



living an ecofriendlier lifestyle.

First, you need to make sure everyone living in your household is on board with the idea of reducing waste.

Once you have people on board, what you are going to do is simple: track and record your outgoing waste. It's recommended to do this for at least a week, to get a clear picture of what your overall waste looks like.

You can sift through your garbage at the end of the week, but it's easier to record it as you toss. Prepare a sheet of paper that has 3 columns. What, How Much, and Notes.

In the notes section, you're going to put any ideas you have for what alternatives there might be to putting this into the landfill.

When you are finished tracking, take a look and see what really stands out as a big waste stream or an easy fix. The results may surprise you and be completely unexpected!
