Sept. 11: First day of Sunday School. This year, we will break out into 2 groups: ages 3 – 9 and those 10 and up.

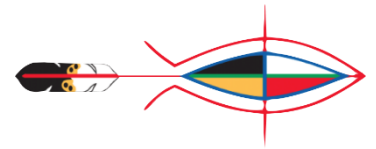
Sept. 10, 17, 24: YouTube Fun program for 10 – 13-year-olds.
