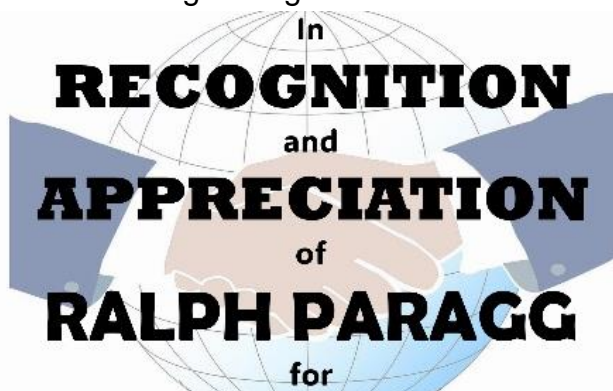

Alexander Campbell came and talked about residential schools and some of his unique experiences. There were 26 children participating, 4 tween helpers, one teen helper, and 7 adult helpers in addition to our Program Director Maegen Plumb.

Although the weather didn't fully cooperate, the children had lots of fun while learning about Indigenous culture.

They loved making Bannock, and thoroughly enjoyed eating it with jam!

We added more rocks to our garden at the front of the church and harvested the rest of our carrots from the children's garden.
