

## Spotlight – June 2026

### Jenny Williams

“Just say I wear many hats!” joked Jenny Williams, about all that she does with and for Immanuel Anglican Church. Jenny is one of the most involved people at Immanuel – in many roles both visible and behind the scenes.

Jenny was the Appointed Warden in 2024 when Rev. Eimsook Joung first came to the parish, and served as Elected Warden the next year. She also joined Vestry in 2024, and continues to serve on Vestry. While she was a Warden, she was part of the Human Resources and Compensation Committee. Jenny has been Envelope Secretary since Immanuel was formed, and works closely with the parish treasurer.

In 2018, when Regina parishes began to consider their futures as one parish, Jenny was a Warden at St. Luke. She stepped down from that position to devote time to the 5-2-1 Process (during which the five legacy parishes became one). She served on the Finance Committee and Administration Committee, both of which were very busy consolidating all the logistical details of running five parishes, into one parish with one system. (Those two committees have now been combined, as the work load is more manageable now.)

In the early years of Immanuel, Jenny was on the Mission and Outreach Committee, as well as Fellowship and Special Events. She continues to belong to the Communications and Technology Committees.



“Children’s ministry is my passion,” Jenny says, and that has been true long before coming to Immanuel. At 16 she taught Sunday School in her home town of St. Catharines, Ontario. After she and her husband moved to Regina in 1981, Jenny taught Sunday School at St. Matthew, where their two daughters were baptized. After a few years the Williams family moved to St. Luke, where Jenny soon became involved in their Sunday School.

At Immanuel, Jenny has been a leading force in many of the programs for children and youth – the Children’s Garden for pre-schoolers; Vacation Bible School on school days off and for a week during the summer; and the monthly Tweens group.

She is also involved in the pollinator garden on the church grounds, and with developing the front yard with food-producing plants and bushes.

All of the committees or groups on which Jenny serves benefit from her education and work experience – she holds a Masters of Business Administration, is a Project Manager Professional, and a Chartered Professional Accountant.

Jenny retired from her career in 2021 and took up the hobby of quilting. She’s an active member of the Caring Crafters – an ecumenical group which produces a variety of hand-crafted items to donate or to sell with the proceeds going to charities. They meet at Living Spirit Centre.

Jenny and her husband, Dave, have been married for 45 years and have three grown children, five grandchildren, and four step-grandchildren.
